***Our Mother of Consolation Parish School Awarded Design Grant from Community Design Collaborative for Design of Outdoor Learning and Play Space***

**Philadelphia, PA (July 15, 2016)** – Our Mother of Consolation (OMC) Parish School was recently awarded a Design Grant from the Community Design Collaborative (Collaborative), an organization that provides pro-bono design services to non-profits. OMC submitted a proposal requesting assistance with the conceptual design of an outdoor learning and play space. A team of volunteers – to include landscape architects, a civil engineer and cost estimator – will work with OMC Parish School representatives and a community task force to represent all voices interested in the completion of this project. As a part of a capital campaign begun in 2013 (*Advancing in Faith & Learning*), the creation of an innovative learning and play space has been an ongoing wish for parents, students, faculty and community members alike.

“The creation of this space will support OMC’s goals as set for its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary milestone,” stated Ms. Heidi Segall Levy, Director of Design Services with the Collaborative. “The space is intended to enhance learning opportunities and the well being of the students, as well as be a resource and amenity to the surrounding community.”

“The end result of the partnership with the Collaborative will be a technical report that will enable us to move forward toward the implementation of this play space and outdoor classroom. The site and specifics have yet to be worked out, but that is the goal of this collaboration. This is something that we have been hoping to accomplish for many years,” according to Colleen Amuso, Director of Advancement at OMC Parish School. “We are grateful to the Collaborative for agreeing to work together with us, and to help us move forward to reach this goal.”

The Collaborative brings together design professionals to match the needs of a project, and offer their services on a pro-bono basis. The value of the Collaborative services for this project are estimated to be approximately \$25,000. OMC Parish School is expected to bring together community members for input and will then use the final documents to build both community and financial support for implementation.
